

Biohazard Spill Clean Up Outside of a Biosafety Cabinet



What's a Minor Spill?

 An event that can be safely handled without assistance of EHS or emergency personnel

What's a Major Spill?

- An event that cannot be handled safely without a assistance from EHS or emergency personnel
- Anytime you or someone else is exposed to hazardous material

Major Spill

- Avoid inhaling airborne
 materials while quickly leaving
 the room Notify others to
 leave the room and close the
 door
- Post a sign on the door indicating the nature and time of the spill
- Remove contaminated clothing/PPE
- Wash all exposed skin with soap and warm water
- 5. Notify EHS and/or GT Police
- 6. EHS to arrange clean-up

Minor Spill

- Avoid inhaling airborne materials
 while quickly leaving the room.
 Notify others to leave the room and
 close the door.
- 2. Post a sign on the door indicating the nature and time of the spill
- 3. Remove contaminated clothing/PPE
- 4. Wash all exposed skin with soap and warm water
- Wait 30 minutes to allow aerosols to settle before entering the spill area for cleaning
- 6. Don appropriate PPE
- Cover spill areas with absorbent material
- 8. Pour liquid disinfectant onto the absorbent material from the outside of the spill area, moving towards the center. Allow for appropriate contact time.
- Collect absorbent material and dispose of as biohazard waste
- 10. Spray work surfaces, cabinets and equipment surrounding the spill area with appropriate disinfectant solution and allow for appropriate contact time before wiping up the areas with absorbent materials
- 11. Remove PPE and wash hands
